From a financial standpoint, the Post paid off its mortgage in 2015; has been on a pay-as-you-go basis for all the efforts described above and in meeting its monthly expenses.

Most importantly, in keeping with the primary purpose of the VFW as an organization, the Post's monetary donations to veterans' causes, to organizations that support veterans and to veterans and the families of veterans in need has increased significantly over the last three years. The following shows the annual donations made for the last four years reflecting the increases in donations that the Post has made:

2013 - 2014	\$8,207
2014 - 2015	\$8,350
2015 - 2016	\$19,150
2016 - 2017	\$18.081

On a different note, I am proud to announce that VFW Calabash Post #7288 has achieved over 100% in membership for the 2016 – 2017 year. I am equally proud to announce that along with achieving over 100% in membership, our Post has completed five other requirements and achieved "All State" status in the VFW North Carolina Department. #### **DD Form 214 Online**

Have you or your family member served in the Armed Forces of the United States but you don't have or are unable to find a copy of the DD-214/Separation Documents? Gaining access to your military personnel records has never been easier. Military personnel records can include DD 214/Separation Documents, service personnel records found within the Official Military Personnel File (OMPF), and medical records. Military personnel records can be used for proving military service or as a valuable tool in genealogical research. This may be particularly helpful when a veteran needs a copy of the DD-214 for employment purposes.

The National Personnel Records Center (NPRC) is working to make it easier for veterans with computers and Internet access to obtain copies of documents from their military files. Military veterans and the next of kin of deceased former military members may now use a new online military personnel records system to request documents.

### **MEMORIAL DAY SERVICES**



VFW Calabash Post #7288. On Memorial Day VFW Calabash Post 7288 along with over 250 members and guests, paid tribute to all veterans who gave their lives in past wars. This year's ceremony included remarks by Calabash Mayor Mary Knight who noted that, "We are forever thankful for the sacrifice by so many service men and women who helped preserve the freedoms we enjoy today." Her remarks followed by Post Commander Rick Arvonio who stated that, "Memorial Day isn't just about honoring veterans, it's about honoring those who lost their lives, those who were so willing to give of themselves to defend their brothers and sisters, their country and our way of life. They made the ultimate sacrifice. Veterans had the ability to come home. Some never came home!"

He went on to say that "Memorial Day is a day we as a country, come together to honor and remember our servicemen and women who answered

America's call to service and paid the ultimate price. Memorial Day is the time for Americans, as one body, to stand up and say, Thank you! We remember you! We are grateful to you! We will never forget you! We remember our fallen and we also honor their loved ones. Mothers. Fathers. Sisters. Brothers. Sons. Daughters. Friends. Every year, families of the fallen are joined together and bound by loss in a way most of us can't even imagine. Military families are something special!"

The guest speaker was Lt. Colonel, U.S. Army (Retired) John G. "Jack" Heslin who completed a 20-year military



career as an Army aviator and is a retired Lieutenant Colonel. Lt. Colonel Heslin spent two tours in Vietnam, 1967-68 and 1971-72, both of which were in the Central Highlands operating out of Camp Holloway in Pleiku. He was a helicopter pilot and operations officer during the Easter Offensive of 1972 in Kontum Province and spoke of his first-hand experience and many insights relating to the military operations of that period especially the Easter Offensive of 1972 and The Battle of Kontum.

Lt. Colonel Heslin spoke that as a tribute to those who fought in one of the largest battles of the Vietnam War, a battle most Americans never heard of, he told the story for so many of my friends who will never be able to tell their story – he told the story on the web so that others could read it and remember - he told

the story on the web so that those who needed to read the story could find it — so that they could find it from anywhere in the world — and they have — to date, millions have found the story — The Battle of Kontum ... and for many, they remember." He went on to read many stories, "voices" of those

who read his story and remembered their loved ones who gave their lives during these long ago battles in Vietnam.

The West Brunswick HS Jr. ROTC Color Guard posted the colors to begin the service. Julie Larsen led in the singing of the National Anthem, Memorial Wreaths were presented by Auxiliary and the Post's Committee for Americanism, Citizenship & Community Service. The singing of "God Bless the USA" by Cathy Milstead brought a fitting close to the ceremony.
