Annual Election of Post Officers

As you read this issue of the Post's newsletter, it is time to begin thinking and planning for our annual nominations and elections of your Post's Officers. The process begins at the Post's March 7, 2017 meeting with the nomination of candidates for the elected positions of Commander,

Senior Vice Commander, Junior Vice Commander, Quartermaster, Chaplain, one 3-Year Trustee and one 3-year House Committee position. These Post Officers will be elected by members at the April meeting. The new officers will be sworn in at the monthly meeting in May and their term will commence on June 5, 2017 after the conclusion of North Carolina State Department Convention.

In addition to the elected officer positions there are appointed officer positions including: Adjutant, Judge Advocate, Surgeon, Officer of the Day, Service Officer, Guard, and Communications Officer. All officer positions (except two Trustee and two House Committee positions) are elected or appointed to one-year terms.
