Annual Golf Tournament - Robert Haight Memorial Veterans Golf Tournament

The Post's annual Veterans Day Golf Tournament, this year, the Robert Haight Memorial Veterans Golf Tournament. This year's tournament honors a longtime VFW Life Member and friend, Robert (Bobby) Haight, a Vietnam Veteran who served in the U.S. Marine Corps Recon Unit. Bobby was an avid golf enthusiast who earlier this year lost a long battle to cancer due to his exposure to and the effects of Agent Orange.

The tournament will be held on 11/14/16 at the Sandpiper Bay Golf & Country Club in Sunset Beach, NC, is open to the public. The tournament is a two-person best ball event, flighted by handicap, including a women's and mixed flight and is limited to the first 72 teams to register.

The donations/funds raised through hole sponsorships, cash donations and proceeds from the tournament help VFW Calabash Post #7288 provide a significant contribution to the Special Operations Warrior Foundation (SOWF)

The Special Operations Warrior Foundation (SOWF) is a 501(c)(3) Charitable Organization and was founded in 1980 to provide support and assistance to the U. S. military's special operations community, which consist Army Special Forces (Green Berets), the Army's 75th Ranger Regiment, the 160th Special Operations Aviation Regiment, Navy Small Boat Teams, Navy SEALs, Air Force Combat Controllers, Air Force rotary and fixed wing squadrons, and Marine Corps special operations personnel. SOWF's mission includes two major aspects in support of special operations personnel:

- providing a full college education to the surviving children of those who lose their lives while serving in the U.S. military special operations community.
- providing immediate financial assistance and support to ensure that severely wounded personnel are able to have their loved ones at their bedside during recovery.

The Charity Navigator has an Overall Score/Rating by Charity Navigator of 98.4 (out of 100) and four (4) Stars for the Special Operations Warrior Foundation (SOWF).

WREATHS ACROSS AMERICA

In 2007, the Worcester family, along with veterans and others who had helped with their annual Christmas wreath ceremony at Arlington National Cemetery, formed Wreaths Across America™ to continue and expand this effort and support other groups around the country who wanted to do the same. This nonprofit organization continues the Arlington tradition as part of its mission to: Remember. Honor. Teach.

In 2015, Wreaths Across America and a national network of volunteers laid over 900,000 memorial wreaths at nearly 1100 locations in the United States and beyond. This was accomplished with help from over 2500 fundraising groups, many corporate contributions, and donations of trucking, shipping, and thousands of helping hands. The annual pilgrimage from Harrington, Maine to Arlington National Cemetery is known as the world's largest veterans' parade, stopping at schools, monuments, veterans' homes and communities all along the way to remind people how important it is to remember, nor and teach. This year, VFW Post #8073 in Whiteville, NC is the local location leader for District 5 to purchase wreaths from this organization for Wilmington National Cemetery. Sharon Kossler will be collecting the donations for VFW Calabash Post #7288 through November 25th. A collection jar with required donor forms will be in the Post Canteen.

An individual wreath donation is \$15 and our Post will receive \$5 back for every wreath donated. Checks should be made payable to "VFW Auxiliary Post 7288" earmarked for ths Across America. The wreaths will be sent directly to the cemetery. We also have the opportunity to participate in the laying of the wreaths in a public ceremony at Wilmington National Cemetery in December. More information will be coming regarding the wreath laying ceremony date and time. CANTEEN RULES

- 1. The Bartender on duty is in charge at all times and will make all decisions.
- 2. Other than the authorized weapons owned by the Post and used for ceremonial purposes, NO firearms or weapons of any kind are allowed on the premises of VFW Calabash Post #7288 regardless of any authorization to carry a firearm, with or without a concealed carry permit.
- 3. With the exception of Guide Dogs, NO pets are allowed in the Post Canteen or in the Post building.
- 4. Profanity is NOT allowed in the Post Canteen at any time.
- 5. The decision as to whether a person will be served is at the Bartenders discretion.
- 6. Members who become loud will be asked to leave.
- 7. The Bartender will ask members and guests to leave once it is determined that they have consumed excessive alcohol.
- 8. If a member or guest enters the Post Canteen under the excessive influence of alcohol, he/she will not be served and be required to leave the premises.
- 9. If any member should become abusive he/she will be directed to leave the premises and shall be brought up on charges.
- 10. Post business shall not be discussed in the Post Canteen.
- 11. No outside soliciting allowed on the Post's premises.
- 12. No person under the age of twenty-one (21) shall be allowed to sit at the bar.
- 13. Members who bring guests into the Post must have the guest sign-in as a guest. Guests are welcome to stay on Post premises as long as their sponsor is present. If a sponsor leaves the Post premises the guest must leave with them.
- 14. No Smoking Allowed as the Post is a NON-SMOKING facility. Smoking is permitted in the area of the Gazebo and members and guests are to use the containers provided for cigarette butts. 15. Members and guests must dress appropriately. Shirts and
- shoes are required. Golf shoes may not be worn in the Post. Tank tops (i.e., those similar to basketball jerseys or beach wear) are not permitted except that women's sleeveless, collarless blouses or shirts are acceptable.

VFW Post 7288 Sponsored Summer Internship

Late in the spring of 2016, our post was contacted by Mrs. Sherry Farmer of Calabash who had a special request for our post: would the VFW be willing to sponsor her grandson in completing his required Student Service Learning Hours. Her grandson, Tyler Thomason, is a student at Damascus High School in Maryland where the school district requires each student to complete a certain amount of community service hours before they graduate. Tyler had 25 hours left to complete his obligation. Commander Arvonio agreed to the project and asked if I would execute a plan for Tyler.

Tyler arrived in the Calabash area during second week of July. At that time Tyler, Mrs. Farmer, Comrade Bob Larson and myself met and outlined a daily plan. Tyler would show up at the post Monday through Friday mornings and Bob Larson would have Tyler helping to clean the post or doing other tasks when necessary. For example, one-day Bob had Tyler painting the posts outside that surround the A/C units. Bob told me Tyler had more paint on himself than on the post, but that he was doing a good job.

Everyday Bob and Tyler would record the hours worked. Tyler also performed a few extra duties such as helping at the NC Sheriff's Association Conference dinner and placing bags on the tables for bingo. It didn't take long before Tyler had the hours he needed to graduate.

Once the 25 hours were completed, I met with Mrs. Farmer and she had me sign off on a school document verifying the completion of hours. She couldn't have been more pleased with the help the VFW gave her grandson.

Overall the project was very successful. I want to thank all the post comrades that helped Tyler, especially Bob Larson, who worked with Tyler every day.

One more note: on the way home on the first day of volunteering, Tyler's grandmother asked him why he was smiling. Tyler said the VFW members were cool. Not a bad compliment from a teenager! And that Comrades, Sisters and Brothers is what the VFW is all about!
