I am also honored and humbled that you have the confidence in me to serve another year as your Commander. Together

this past year we have succeeded in our myriad efforts and will continue to do so in the year to come to ensure our mission to support veterans and their families. Our work, however, is not done! As long as there are veterans in need we will work hard to ensure that we provide the necessary support. So please join me in the coming year, volunteer to support our efforts and reap the reward of having accomplished so much for our veterans in need.

## **New Automated External Defibrillator (AED)**

VFW Calabash Post #7288 has purchased a Life Saving Automated External Defibrillator – AED for short. The new unit is mounted in the Canteen where it is easily accessible when needed.

Every minute counts in a <u>Sudden Cardiac Arrest Emergency</u> – Sudden Cardiac Arrest strikes 800 Americans per day. For every minute without treatment a victim's rate of survival decreases by 7% to 10%.

AED's today are simple to use. They are located in malls, schools, churches and places where certain populations are a high risk. To use an AED you check for signs of <u>Sudden Cardiac Arrest</u>: the person is unresponsive and not breathing normally. To use an AED is simple as 1. Pull, 2. Place the pads and 3. Press the shock button.

Heartsaver AED and CPR (Cardiopulmonary Resuscitation) training will be conducted at the Post in the near future. Wayne Spears, a certified American Heart Association Instructor will be conducting these 1 hour training sessions. We would like to get as many members trained on this lifesaving equipment as possible. Our Canteen bartenders and Post Officers will all receive the training. The

more people who know CPR and how use an AED, the better chance of survival. Knowing CPR and how to use an AED can be a life saver outside the Post!

Keep an eye out for sign-up sheets for the AED & CPR classes on the bulletin boards in the Post. We also will be sending email announcements and reminders regarding the training classes to our members.

Just remember, we invested in an AED and we need to make sure that we have members who are trained and can use it within three to five minutes of a heart stopping, so we can improve the chances of saving a life – ANYWHERE!

### **Memorial Day 2015**

The Post's Memorial Day Ceremony was held at 10:00 a.m. on May 25, 2015 and was witnessed by over 200 attendees. The ceremony began with the Posting of the Colors assisted by the West Brunswick High School JROTC Color Guard; the singing of the National Anthem by Kathy Milstead, Ladies Auxiliary; the Opening Prayer by Post Chaplain James Stueve; and remarks by Calabash Mayor, Mary Louise Knight.

Post Commander, Rick Arvonio's remarks included his family's story about his great uncle that died in World War I at the age of 18; followed by Ladies Auxiliary President Fran Redfield's remarks and laying of the wreaths by incoming Ladies Auxiliary President Brenda Paige and Nancy Earney and Men's Auxiliary's Past President, Anthony Nye and Jr. Vice President Wayne Spears.

Our keynote speaker, U.S. Air Force General Wayne R.



Monteith was introduced by the Commander and during his remarks he spoke about North Carolinians who gave their lives during past and present wars and praised them for

living up to the standard which all military members understand when they take oath to defend the constitution of the United States against all enemies foreign and domestic. General Monteith said if we're to honor those who gave their lives, we must repay their sacrifice by continuing the legacy of valor and sacrifice that they exemplified.

General Monteith thanked our World War II veterans "the greatest generation" and asked them to stand or raise their hands to be recognized. At that moment, General Monteith stepped forward and saluted each of them as a heartfelt recognition for their service and sacrifice!

The ceremony continued with the reading of the names of 21 comrades who passed away since last year's Memorial Day



Ceremony, ringing a bell after each name was read, followed by a rifle salute and the playing of TAPS.

A closing prayer was given by Ladies Auxiliary Chaplain, April Farguhar.

At the conclusion of the ceremony the over 200 attendees joined Kathy Milstead, Ladies Auxiliary in singing Lee Greenwood's "Proud to be an American". Awesome!!

General Monteith took time after the ceremony to share thoughts with World War II veterans Pat Patterson (ex-POW), Hank Mattutat and Bud Sweetman and spent time speaking with other members and quests.
