WORLD WAR II VETERANS PARTY

On Saturday, December 12, 2015, VFW Calabash Post 7288 hosted an annual dinner party in honor of World War Two veterans and in remembrance of Pearl Harbor. Commander Rick Arvonio, noting that his father and other family members served in World War Two, offered a salute to the World War Two veterans gathered at the celebration in their honor. "You are our heroes," Arvonio told them, "and we cannot repay or thank you enough." Commander Arvonio's remarks were followed by those from Calabash Mayor Mary Knight who expressed her pride in being involved with the Post's recognition of the the World War Two veterans' service in a war that changed history forever. There was a moment of silence and a prayer to remember those who lost their lives in the attack on Pearl Harbor and the singing of the National Anthem and "God Bless America."

That set the tone for the affair in which those members of the "Greatest Generation" enjoyed food, fellowship and entertainment during the party in their honor. In addition there were over a 120 other veterans and their families gathered for the festive event to thank the

guests of honor for their service and to join them in a sit-down dinner with table service provided by the Post's Auxiliary. Three veterans were singled out to receive the World War Two Veterans Honor and Remembrance Medallion, presented by Tom Perrone of the Marine Corps League. Receiving that honor were Hal Riebesehl, Leo Jarmusz and Jim Quigley.

While Christmas favorites were sung by featured entertainers Larry Tanelli and Claudette, Claudette presented each veteran of World War Two a hat that said "World War Two Veteran" and "Merry Christmas." One veteran was given a copy of Tom Brokaw's book "The Greatest Generation." The entertainment, by Larry Tanelli & Claudette, was perfect for the occasion with the duo's performance of old standards mixed with Christmas music which had many singing along. Larry thrilled Dottie Hoffman, widow of World War Two veteran Al Hoffman, by dancing with her during the singing of "At Last." It was a moment she will always remember and the party was an event none of those who were present will ever forget.
