COMMANDERS MESSAGE



"Nobody does more for Veterans than the VFW!"

By now most of us have weathered the storm, so-to-speak. That is Hurricane Matthew. Hurricane Matthew created a crisis situation for too many throughout North Carolina and in particular, veterans and their families in Brunswick County and points farther west in the state. Here along the immediate coast, we were much more fortunate, unlike many other veterans in North Carolina. Many of these

areas remained flooded and rivers continued to rise for several days after the storm. Thousands of people, including over 1,500 veterans and VFW members, lost their homes and all of their belongings, and the number affected continued to grow.

On the morning of Monday, October 17, 2016 an email was sent out to all members of our Post and surrounding communities asking for monetary donations and household items in need. By day's end, donations came pouring in and continued at a steady pace for a full week. All totaled, over the past week the Post collected needed household items including over 150 cases of bottled water, blankets, pillows, bedding, brooms, mops, medical supplies, non-perishable food items, pet food, toiletries and more. The generosity of so many in this time of need, resulted in donations of over 4,000 pounds of needed items and \$4,000 in monetary donations, and counting. Donations came from members of the Post, the Auxiliary, the Men's Auxiliary, the Post's Monday Golf League, the Wednesday Tee-Birds and the Friday Golf Group, Tidewater Golf Members, residents in local communities, churches, friends and families. On Monday, October 24 th , volunteers from Post #7288 loaded a rented 26-foot box truck with the donations and the next day transported and unloaded them at a distribution point in Spring Lake, NC. When the call went out – THEY ANSWERED THE CALL! The overwhelming response to the request for donations proves that "Nobody Does More for Veterans" than the VFW! Once again VFW Calabash Post #7288 stepped up. Thank you to everyone who contributed to this worthwhile and necessary cause to help our veterans in need. Your donations will greatly help them on the road to recovery.

One veteran per day commits suicide and females are 500% more successful at ending their lives. This commitment on the part of VA coincides with National President Colette Bishop's Homeless Veterans Special Project. State politicians spoke directly about the state of our military and the security of our country.

Remember, one-stop early voting period continues until Nov 5. Be sure to make your vote count by voting November 8 in the general elections. If we don't speak up for our veterans and their needs by voting, who will?

At VFW Calabash Post #7288 it was a case of "Serving the Deserving" when The Warrior Ride Coastal Carolina Tour ended the last leg of their ride at the Post where nearly 60 riders and staff enjoyed a sturdy lunch of meat loaf, mashed potatoes, green beans, roll and a beverage of their choice. The Warrior Ride was founded in North Carolina by Oak Island's Bob Racine and his late wife Debra ten years ago and as VFW Calabash Post #7288 Commander Rick Arvonio said before the meal was served "We've been waiting for you and looking forward to when you'd be here," a sentiment shared by Calabash Mayor Mary Knight who told them "You are appreciated beyond words."

The lunch at the Post has become a staple of The Warrior Ride each year and the pleasure of having these disabled veterans grows each time they return. The riders use specially fitted bicycles to make their treks in various locations throughout the United States and by doing so take increasing pride in their skills and redefine their capabilities. There's no cost to the service members in the ride and all expenses are paid through donations and grants.

Some of these riders come back year after year and are an inspiration to VFW Calabash Post #7288 members as they witness the increasing confidence and determination that each rider displays.

As Post Commander Arvonio said, "We can't wait until you come back!"
