Annual Election of Post Officers

As you read this January/February 2015 issue of the newsletter, it is time to begin thinking and planning for our annual nominations and elections of your Post's Officers. The process begins in March with nomination of candidates for the elected positions of Commander, Senior Vice Commander, Junior Vice Commander, Quartermaster, Chaplain, Judge Advocate, Surgeon and Trustees (3). These Post Officers will be elected by members at the April meeting. The new officers will be sworn in at the monthly meeting in May and their term will commence in June after the North Carolina State Department Convention concludes.

In addition to the elected officer positions there are a number of appointed officer positions including: Adjutant, Judge Advocate, Surgeon, Officer of the Day and Service Officer and Communications Officer. Except for the three Trustees for which there is a one, two and three year Trustee position, all other officer positions are elected or appointed to one-year terms.

and/or attended this function. The profits from the party was added to half of the money we made supporting the Oyster Festival and we donated \$1,000 to the Department of North Carolina's Special Project "HOMELESS VETERANS". This means that our donation to this program will assist the homeless veterans in our state. We delivered 20 boxes of supplies for the Blue star Mother's "Christmas Boxes for Heroes" Project. Because of your generosity they were able to pack over 250 individual boxes which were sent to our troops overseas in time for Christmas. On 12, 14 and 21 November 2014 we presented our Citizenship Education Program at Waccamaw and Union Elementary Schools. We had over 160 2nd graders between the two schools and the presentation was very well received by both the teachers and the students. Thanks to all those auxiliary sisters who helped put the packages together and attended the sessions with me.
