## POW/MIA CEREMONY - WE MUST NEVER FORGET.

They walk among us and we often don't notice. They have a special day in their honor and we often forget. We're talking about National POW/MIA Recognition Day which is always the third Friday in September.

In Brunswick County there are a lot of veterans of our nation's services but there is a special breed within that number - those who were held prisoner of war. A good number of those are back, but there are a lot still missing in action.

On the special day to recognize them nearly a hundred people came to VFW Calabash Post #7288 to remember, honor and reflect on the sacrifices of those who have ever been held prisoner of war or who are still missing and to show their appreciation for the POWs who walk among us.



One of those is Pat Patterson, a member of the Calabash VFW Post, who never misses one of these events. During the POW/MIA ceremony held at the Post on September 19th, there was sustained арplause when he

was recognized and afterwards many wanted to shake his hand and thank him for his service in those difficult times 70 years ago.

Patterson is a World War Two veteran whose B-24 bomber shot down on July 15th, 1944. He was held in a German prison camp for nearly a year. He received his wings from flight school on the 3rd of November two years prior. He still has the original wings on his

Prisoner of War hat that he wears to VFW meetings and other events at the Post. He's a living example of what the National POW/MIA Recognition Day in America is all about.

During the somber and symbolic ceremony there are presentations of tributes which go on a table, a poem called "Come for Me" which symbolizes a plea from those still held prisoner who are reaching out to the government to help them, the touching empty chair ceremony in which the items on the table represent those still held prisoner and the empty chair, symbolic of those who cannot share in the event. Candles are then lit representing those still missing from our nation's wars.

There are many: from World War II 73,536 are still missing or held; from Korea, 7,880; from the Cold War, 126: from Vietnam 1,641; and from Iraq and Afghanistan 6 remain missing or held prisoner.

These figures are not historic in nature. They're as of September 15<sup>th</sup> of this year. For those who walk among us, our deepest thank you! For those who are still missing, 83,189 in all, you are in our prayers.
