4th of July Post Picnic - Our Post and the many volunteers pulled out all the stops for its Fourth of July Picnic to provide food, fun and fireworks for over 150 who attended the event. Hamburgers and hotdogs were grilled by Post Men's Auxiliary members Joe Nance, Richard Wilder and Chas Rowe; fresh watermelon provided by Post member Willie Richardson and cookies and cake were provided by members of the Ladies Auxiliary.

Summary

Our work, however, is not done! Over the next two months, we have many activities in the works and are looking for volunteers for their support in any way possible. Automated External Defibrillator (AED) & CPR Training

As previously reported, the Post purchased a Life Saving Automated External Defibrillator – AED for short. The new unit is mounted in the Canteen where it is easily accessible should it ever be needed. Every minute counts in a <u>Sudden Cardiac Arrest Emergency</u> – Sudden Cardiac Arrest strikes 800 Americans per day. For every minute without treatment a victim's rate of survival decreases by 7% to 10%.

Heartsaver AED and CPR (Cardiopulmonary Resuscitation) training has been conducted by Wayne Spears, a certified American Heart Association Instructor. At this time, over 28 members, including all bartenders have been trained. Additional 1-hour training sessions are planned. If you are interested, sign-up sheets are on the bulletin board in the Post Canteen.

Just remember, we invested in an AED and we need to make sure that we have members who are trained and can use it within three to five minutes of a heart stopping, so we can improve the chances of saving a life – ANYWHERE!

National Convention Important Information

The VFW passed a resolution to amend Article Xi, Sections 1101-1104 of their National Bylaws at our 116th National Convention in

Pittsburgh on July 20, allowing male family members to join the VFW Auxiliary **effective August 21, 2015.** A few facts about the change:

• It is NOT a merger of the VFW's Ladies Auxiliary and the Men's Auxiliary.

 It changes the name of the Ladies Auxiliary to VFW Auxiliary and allows spouses and eligible male relatives to join the VFW Auxiliary.

 Males who wish to join the VFW Auxiliary will be required to fill out a membership application, provide proof of eligibility, and their application will be voted on just as females who wish to join.

While our members have many questions regarding this transition, we will embrace the change in our Ladies Auxiliary and implement the changes as instructed by National.

Various Resolutions, amendments to the National Bylaws, and revisions to the Ritual were presented and voted on at Convention.

Our Past Department President, Janice Holm, won the Outstanding Department President of the Year Award. Our Department also received some Program awards in our designated group.
